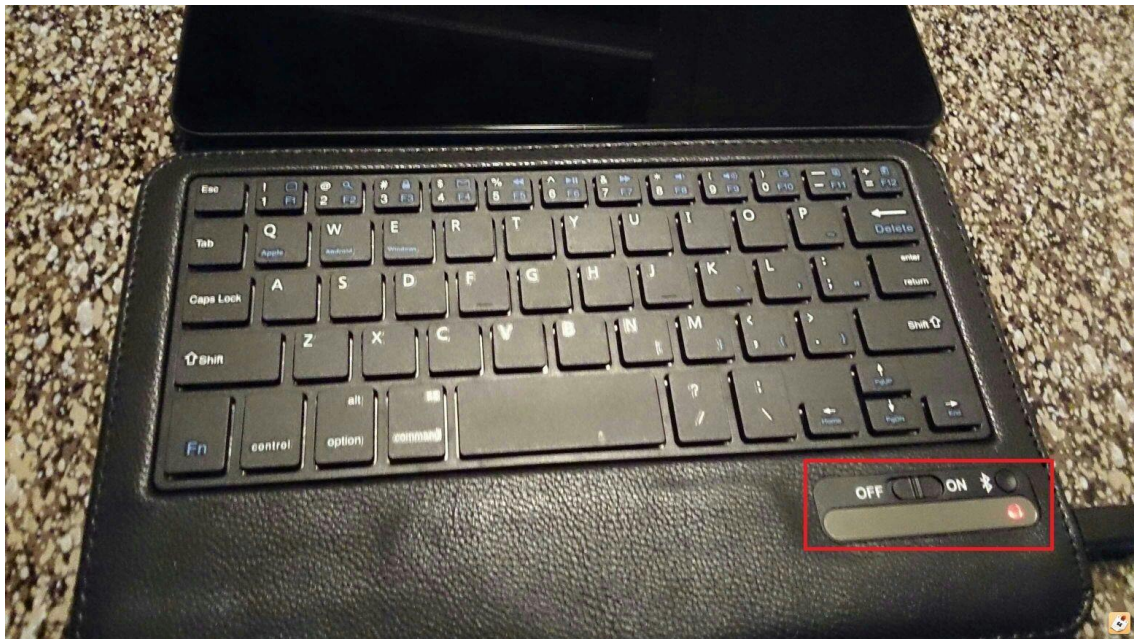


## How to pair a wireless keyboard with an Android

1. Charge the keyboard for at least 4-6 hours before first pairing.
2. Turn off the keyboard (there should be an ON/OFF switch on the front or side of the keyboard, depending on the model.)



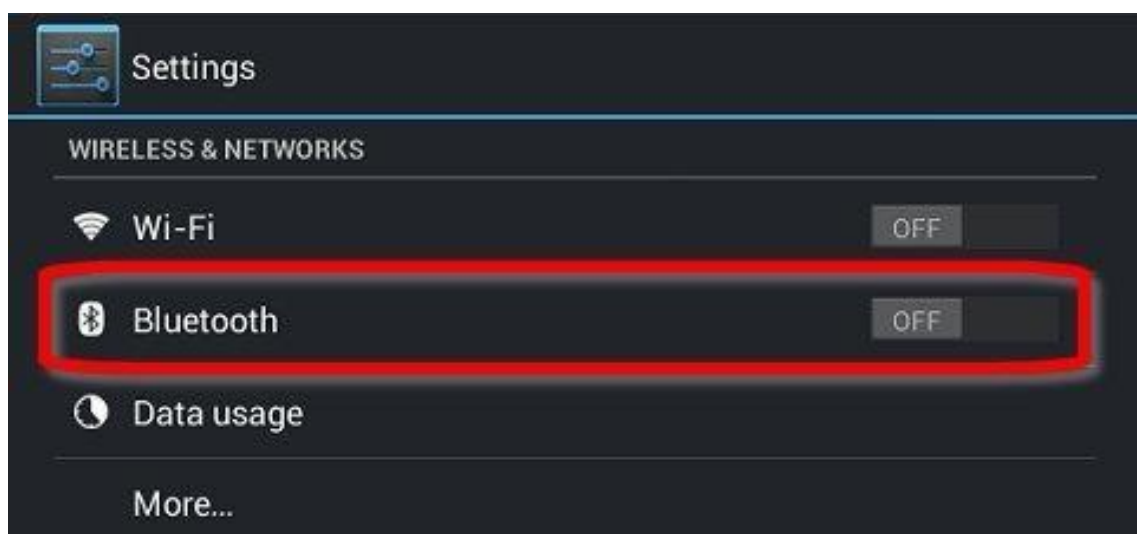
3. Restart your tablet.



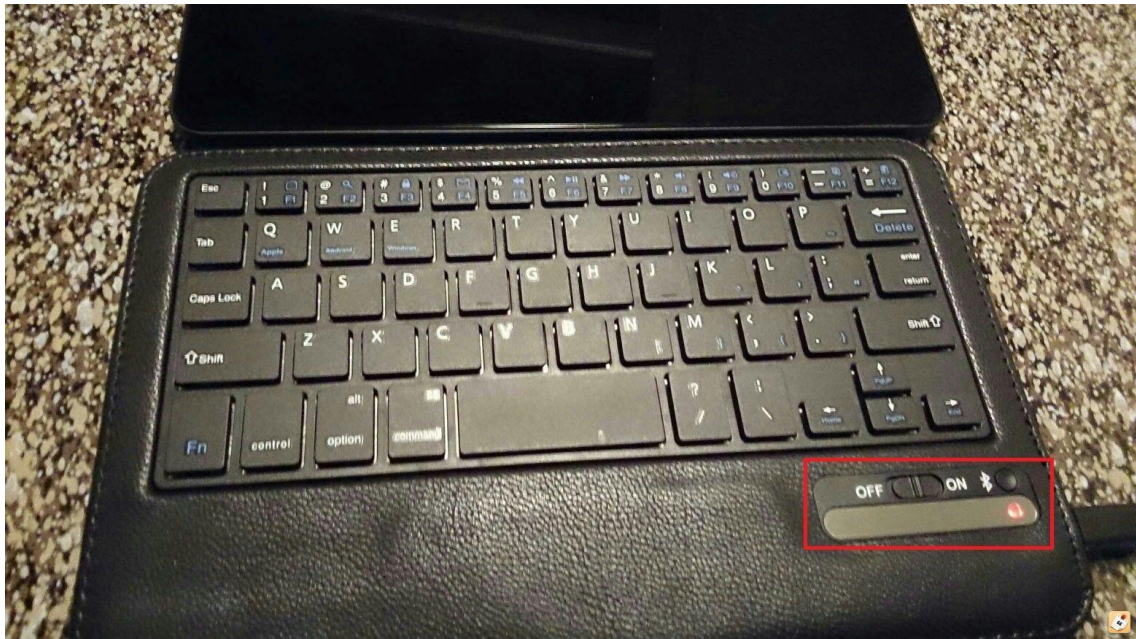
4. Go to **SETTINGS** and then **WIRELESS & NETWORKS** in your tablet (may vary slightly depending on Android version).



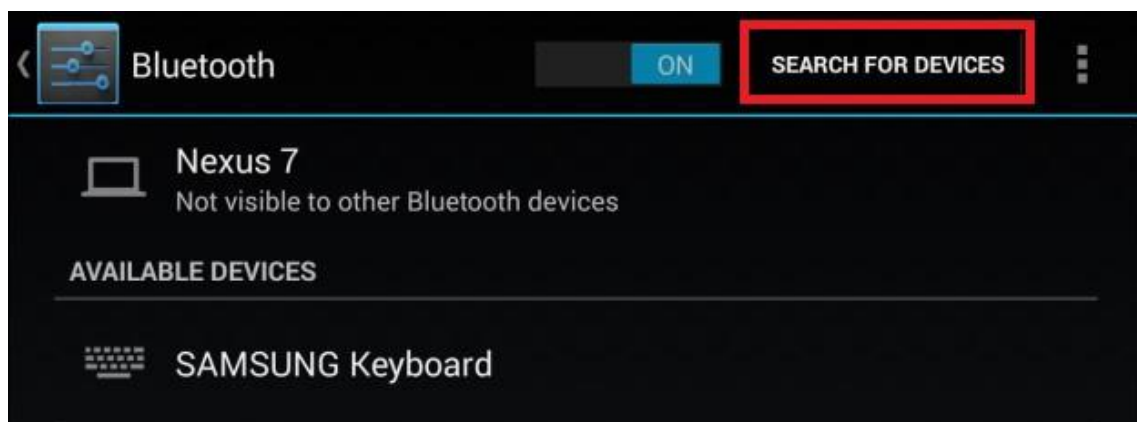
5. Make sure that Bluetooth is ON



6. Turn on your keyboard and make it discoverable by pressing the Bluetooth button (depending on keyboard model you will need to press the Bluetooth switch/button OR click Fn+C keys. If the Bluetooth icon will be on the 'C' key, you will know that you should press the combination of keys to enable the Bluetooth signal)

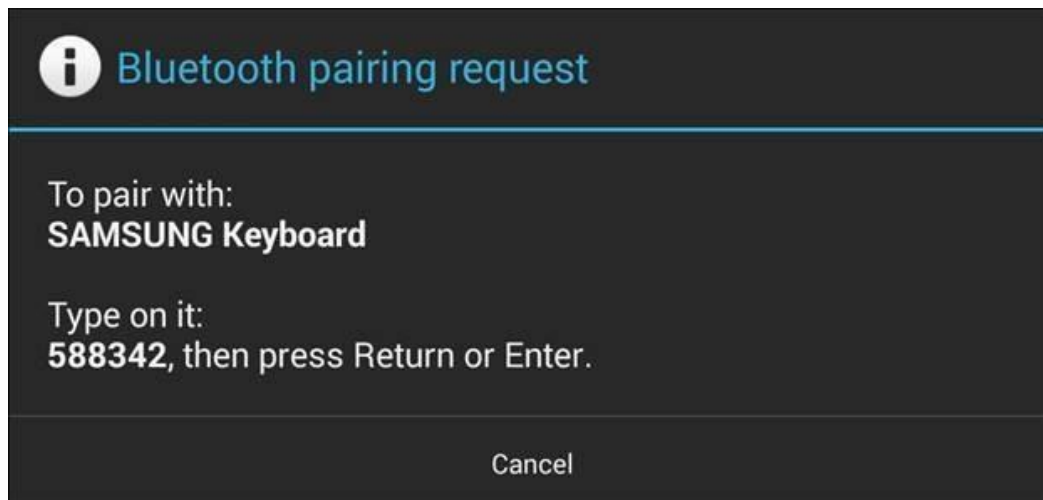


7. Press 'SEARCH FOR DEVICES' in the Bluetooth settings of your tablet. The keyboard which you're trying to add should show up at the bottom of the list.





8. Tap on the device listed under “AVAILABLE DEVICES”, you will see ‘Bluetooth pairing request’ with pairing code.

10. Type the code shown on the tablet via the keyboard and press ‘Return’ or ‘Enter’ key on the keyboard.
11. Keyboard and tablet should be paired now.

**Important note:**

- If you’ll experience problems pairing the keyboard in the future, please start the process from the beginning: remove the keyboard from the list of paired devices on your tablet, charge the keyboard for at least 4-6 hours and try to pair it using steps described above.
- Some pairing issues may occur if your tablet has low battery – make sure to charge it.
- If your keyboard will not pair even if it’s fully charged, then it may be defective.
